"Welcome Home!"

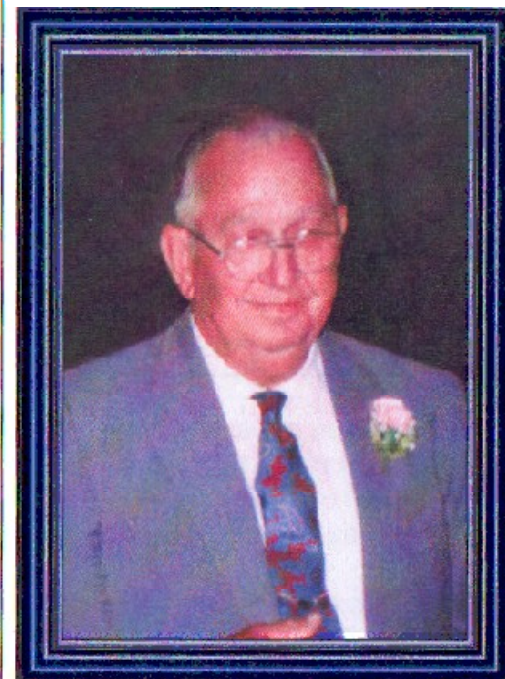
The 23rd Psalm

KENNETH R. GUIER, 84, of Winfield, Kansas, passed away Friday evening, January 13, 2006 at the Sumner Regional Medical Center in Wellington, Kansas.

Born on June 4, 1921 in Niotaze, Kansas, he was the son of Walter and Pearl (Holeman) Guier. He was raised and received his education in Peru, Kansas where he graduated from Peru High School in 1940. A veteran of World War II, Mr. Guier proudly served his country in the United States Navy. He was a machinists' mate on the Mine Destroyer and was honorably discharged in 1945.

He was united in marriage on November 22, 1944 to Evelyn Olech in Reno, Nevada. The couple made their home in Ponca City, Oklahoma. The couple lived in Chicago, Illinois for a short time and he was employed for the railroad. The couple then settled in Ponca City, Oklahoma where he was employed for Continental Oil Company.
